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

WHAT IS QUALITATIVE RESEARCH?

Qualitative research is a type of research that explores and provides deeper insights into **real-world problems**.[3] Qualitative research gathers participants' **experiences**, perceptions, and behavior.[4] Qualitative research is one of the methods in social science research. A main purpose of the method is to describe **relationships between people and societies.**[5] Qualitative research is especially effective in obtaining culturally specific information about the values, opinions, behaviors, and social contexts of **particular populations**.[6] Qualitative research is a type of research that aims to gather and analyse non-numerical (descriptive) data in order to gain an understanding of individuals' **social reality, including understanding their attitudes, beliefs, and motivation**.[7] The primary purpose of conducting qualitative research is to understand the individual's **thoughts**, **feelings**, **opinions**, **and reasons behind these emotions**.[8] Qualitative research is concerned with **feelings**, **ideas**, **or experiences**.[9]

 rather than local words.



The writing should be direct and precise and always written in the past tense. [25] In the social and behavioral sciences, it is important to always provide sufficient information to allow other researchers to adopt or replicate your methodology. This information is particularly important when a new method has been developed or an innovative use of an existing method is utilized. [26]

For major doctoral degrees, methods for conducting mixed quantitative and qualitative research include

- 1) population and sample, 2) research tools,
 - 3) gathering data, and 4) data analysis.




